	Cllr Wren reported the following on behalf of Cllr Sayer: Regarding the NPPF, on the 22nd December
	the government consultation will be undertaken until 2 <sup>nd</sup> March 2023. The discussed changes include
	the policy and changing housing targets. Key points that are being looked at are not to review or alter green belt boundaries and the housing need assessment made in 2018 not changing.
	Perrysfield Farm – the proposal is not a planning application. It is a public consultation to determine the development in a Greenbelt and in a conservation area
	Cllr Wren reported that inappropriate behaviour by a lone male in Oxted caused havoc over four days – there is now an order in place that he is not allowed to return to Oxted
	Oxted Parish Council are currently tendering for CCTV installation in Oxted and Hurst Green.
	Temporary Stop Notice was issued due to a breach of planning with Caravans in December 2022. The current land owners have connected to mains utilities, put in drains etc. However last Friday a full Stop

Notice was served. The owners may possibly put in a full planning application in the future.

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The Planning Department still have ongoing problems with the IT system

58.	PARISH ENVIRONMENT
58.1	Tandridge Parish Council discussed requests from parishioners to install speed deterrents. Cllr McIntosh advised that the speed limits are correct at present. Further enforcement would be costly to instigate.  Going forward, it is possible to request further police presence when traffic diversions are in place rerouting cars along Tandridge Lane.  Concerns have been raised over super cars racing on Tandridge Lane, during the day. The cars line up on Ray Lane and meet at the Red Barn, usually on weekends and bank holidays. The clerk is to report this to the Police.
58.2	Councillors agreed the pot holes on Tandridge Lane and throughout the parish are terrible. Cllr Wren advised to report all instances to Surrey County Council regarding tyre and wheel damage, and claim the costs where necessary.
58.3	Councillors acknowledged the reply from Network Rail regarding the retaining wall of the bridge at the Brickmakers arms and were pleased to learn structurally the bridge is not a concern. The response is noted below:  Dear Mrs Crouch Thank you for contacting us about flooding near one of our bridges.  I have discussed this with our structures team who have informed me that the collapsed wall and debris is not part of our structure.  We carrying out regular examinations of our structures and the latest examination showed no concerns for the structural integrity of the underbridge.  We would not put depth markers here as it would be for the local authority who maintain the public highway to decide whether they could put markers here.  I hope this is of help.  Kind regards Paula Williams
58.4	Tandridge Parish Council discussed the possibility of installing a depth marker for flood waters underneath the bridge at the Brickmakers Arms. It was decided that the depth marker would not stop the issue of stranded cars in flood water. Tandridge Parish Council resolved not to further any action on this point.
