## 47. REPORTS

## 47.1 | County Councillor Report from Cllr MacIntosh

Resurfacing on Tandridge Lane is now completed

The Walk has been now added to the Horizon Program – LSR scheme – it is on the minor resurfacing scheme and as is Tandridge Lane from the A25 to Jackass Lane.

Winter Service is now active – Tandridge Lane is a priory one route. Clerk will check if the grit bins are parish or county responsibility

Drainage is being looked at in more depth and Surrey County Council are investment in this further. The drainage under the railway bridge is being actively looked at – there is another 8 million going into the budget to maintain and look after the areas.

Chalk Pit site – planning application was being decided by Surrey, however Tandridge District Council have taken legal advice and are challenging who decides this application.

More powers for County Council on education and health etc

James Wellbourne is the new contact for Surrey Highways relating to Gateways – Previously Phillippa who has now internally moved. Cllr MacIntosh and the Clerk will pick this up and again and liaise regarding the costs for this.

## **47.2** District Councillor Report

Local Government Finance – Tandridge District Council ended last financial year with a small surplus and will be held against contingencies. However TDC are still looking for further savings to pursue. £5m per annum has been savings and revenue budget of £12m

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Grounds Maintenance Programme – housing, playgrounds, hedges etc has been reorganised and reviewed. Choice has been made to use both in house and external contractors.

2,500 units of Council Housing stock in Tandridge District Council with two active development program which has been delayed and problematic with contractors going bust etc. The general problem of cost increase across the construction industry has been difficult to find builders. Investment partner to Grant England – and this gives ability to access funding.

Oldencraig Mews development – three buyers have now received their keys.

TDC have been awarded £197,000 swimming pool support fund which will be used to support the leisure centres.

Applications need to be submitted by 11<sup>th</sup> December for the Household Support Fund. This is Grant funding for people in material need in the district
